Support Programs for Single Parents



Single Parents Alliance of America (SPAOA): Single Parents Alliance of America is open to all male and female single parents residing in the United States. Membership to the SPAOA is free and voluntary, providing plenty of opportunities for single parents to establish connections and seek financial advice, academic scholarships, and access to support programs for themselves and their children. SPAOA members are also eligible to use exclusive coupons, gift cards, and discounts from partner brands and organizations (<u>source</u>).

Single Mom Coalition: The Single Mom Coalition is a private organization that was constructed to assist unmarried, divorced, and widowed mothers who are legal residents of the United States. This coalition has partnered with multiple sponsors and support groups to provide financial aid, education, medical care, career training, housing programs, and other basic needs to its members. Single moms who join this organization can also access information and that will help them improve their parenting skills (source).

Single Parent Support Network (SPSN): The Single Parent Support Network Network collaborates with other organizations and resources to engage, empower, and inspire single moms and dads across the United States. The SPSN offers many programs on life coaching, family mentoring, leadership training, and scholarship opportunities for single parents and their children. They also have a free app called ReSTART that contains parenting tips, community talks, and their exclusive TV Channel (<u>source</u>).

Freecycle: Single parents can use Freecycle request for free furniture, children's clothes, baby equipment, and sporting goods from nearby families that are giving away their old items. Sign up for a free account, find your local Freecycle Group, and create a listing (source).

Influenster: Influenster is giving away free makeup and skincare products, house cleaning products, snacks, coffee, and other regular-sized products from popular brands. Single parents can sign up for a free account to receive these items in an Influenster VoxBox, and they can review each item to keep them permanently (source).

PinchMe: Single parents can sign up to PinchMe to receive free samples of makeup products, food items, pet supplies, and more. Become a member by answering a simple questionnaire, and no credit card is required (<u>source</u>).

Food Savings for Single Parents



Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP): SNAP is a government-funded program under the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) that provides financial assistance for low-income families. Single parents that are qualified under the SNAP Eligibility Requirements can receive food stamps to secure nutritious meals for themselves and their children. Call the USDA Food and Nutrition Service at <u>703-305-2062</u> for more information (source).

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC): Single mothers that are either breastfeeding or non-breastfeeding postpartum can request support from the WIC program of the USDA Food and Nutrition Service. Qualified individuals will receive referrals for health care, nutrition education grants, and supplemental food for themselves and their children who are less than 5 years old. This includes low-income mothers that are breastfeeding or non-breastfeeding postpartum well as children up to the age of 5. Call 1-800-522-5006, visit the USDA website or contact your nearest agency that provides WIC services (source).

National School Lunch Program (NSLP): The National School Lunch Program provides USDA Foods to public schools, child care institutions, and non-profit private schools. Single parents whose children are eligible for SNAP and other federal assistance programs can also request free lunch meals or cash reimbursements for low-cost food purchases from the NSLP, so their children can have a balanced nutritional diet. School Breakfast Program: The School Breakfast Program is a government-funded assistance program that partners with public and non-profit private high schools and elementary schools to provide free or low-cost breakfast meals that adhere to USDA Food standards. Single parents from low income households are generally accepted to SBP and other food assistance programs. Check the SBP Fact Sheet for more details (source).

Team Nutrition: Team Nutrition was created by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service to promote healthy eating habits and overall physical health to children, teenagers, and adults. Single parents can download the free Team Nutrition Resource Catalog in PDF to find the best

training programs, nutrition education materials, and technical assistance for their children (source).

Special Milk Program (SMP): Single parents of children in non-profit private or public preK-12 schools are eligible to receive free milk or buy them at a reduced cost if their child's school is a participant of the USDA's Special Milk Program. The SMP is prioritized by the government in qualified schools that are not enrolled in other federal meal service programs such as SNAP, SBP, and NSLP. Child and Adult Care Food Program: The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) of the USDA Food Nutrition Service provides cash reimbursements to day care centers so they can purchase nutritious meals for children. Single parents can request for free meals or affordable meals for their children if they are enrolled at a CACFP-supported day care center or after-school care program (<u>source</u>).

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP): The USDA Summer Food Service Program or Summer Meals Program reimburses its partner schools that purchase nutritious snacks and meals for students that are 18 years old and below. Children of single parents from low-income sectors can continue to get free or low-cost healthy food when they are enrolled in schools supported by the SFSP (source).

Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP): Single parents that belong to low-income households can apply to the government's Emergency Food Assistance Program to receive nutritious USDA Foods for free. Qualified recipients of the TEFAP can also apply for other USDA food assistance programs. Cars 4 Christmas: Cars 4 Christmas is a non-profit organization that acquires vehicles from donations and gives them to individuals and families with low income but requires basic transportation for their needs. Single parents that are eligible to enter this program can fill up the application form online (source).

Good News Garage: Single parents from Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Vermont can apply to Good News Garage if they are qualified to receive affordable and reliable transportation. Visit their website to read the full requirements from each state (<u>source</u>).

Working Cars for Working Families: The National Consumer Law Center's Working Cars for Working Families program provides affordable rates to low-income families so they can purchase or finance a vehicle. Healthcare Savings for Single Parents



Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP): The Children's Health Insurance Program provides low-cost health coverage to children from families that are not financially qualified for Medicaid (<u>source</u>).

Medicaid: Medicaid is a federal program that provides medical assistance to low-income families who cannot afford sufficient health insurance. Single parents can apply for Medicaid if they fall under one of the following <u>eligible groups</u>. Prescription Medicines: SPAOA members qualify for special medical insurance plans that allow them to purchase select prescription medicines at a discounted price (<u>source</u>).

Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD): The HUD <u>Housing Choice Voucher Program</u> provides free housing to families that meet the eligibility criteria for low income. Single parents that qualify for a housing choice voucher must contact or visit their nearest <u>Public Housing Agencies</u>. Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP): Single parents from low-income households can apply to the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program for financial assistance on the payment of electrical bills, which includes cooling and heating costs. SafeLink Wireless: Single parents can register with SafeLink Wireless to receive a free GSM-compatible smartphone that includes free monthly calling minutes and additional data each month. Enter your zip code to view the available plans at your area (source).

LifeLine: The Lifeline program under the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) provides discounted telephone lines to low-income individuals. Single mothers that qualify for LifeLine can get a discount of up to \$9.25 per month on either phone or internet services, but not both. Register using the National Verifier application system (source).

Assurance Wireless: Single parents from select states can register with Assurance Wireless to receive a free cellular phone that includes monthly minutes and data as well as unlimited texts. To qualify, the applicant must belong to a low income household or is registered to federal assistance programs such as SNAP or Medicaid (source).

Child Education Savings for Single Parents



Early Head Start: Single moms from low-income families can enroll in Early Head Start if they are pregnant or have a child who is not more than 3 years old. The Early Head Start is a government-funded program that helps single parents develop a healthy parent-child relationship through educational learning and activities. This program also prioritizes the child's physical and cognitive development until they turn 3 years old (source).

Head Start: Head Start is an Early Childhood Program funded by the federal government that focuses on the cognitive, social, and emotional development of children ages 3-5 years old. Single parents can apply to this program as well to improve their parenting and communication skills (source).

Scholarships For Single Parents



Adult Students in Scholastic Transition (ASIST): The Executive Women International (EWI) ASSIST Scholarship Program offers financial aid to non-traditional students enrolled in a college, trade school, university. This includes single parents who are either unemployed or working part-time or full-time. Visit the EWI website for the complete list of requirements (source).

ANSWER Scholarship Endowment: Single parents who are at least 25 years old and have a child in preK-12 are eligible to apply for the ANSWER Scholarship Endowment. The minimum amount awarded by this scholarship depends if the applicant is enrolled in a 4-year undergraduate degree (\$4000), a 2-year nursing degree (\$2,000), or a 2-year degree in the Central Piedmont Community College's Health Careers Program (\$2,000). Arkansas Single Parent Scholarship Fund: The Arkansas Single Parent Scholarship Fund (ASPSF) was created to financially support single parents who legally reside in the State of Arkansas or Bowie County, Texas. Eligible applicants must have a high school diploma, a GPA of 2.0, and proof that they require financial aid. Visit the ASPSF website for the complete list of deadlines and guidelines (source).

ASSP Foundation Family Scholarship Fund: The ASSP Foundation Family Scholarship Fund is granted to the dependents and spouses of individuals who lost their lives in work-related incidents. The applicant must be enrolled part-time or full-time in a community college, trade/vocational school, or university (source).

Beatrice F. Kroesche Memorial Scholarship: Single parents enrolled in the Department of English or the College of Education at the University of can apply for the Beatrice F. Kroesche Memorial Scholarship. Non-freshman applicants must be in good standing with a minimum of 12 hours of study credit and must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher (source).

Bruce and Marjorie Sundlun Scholarship: The Bruce and Marjorie Sundlun Scholarship is funded by donations given to the Rhode Island Foundation. This scholarship is awarded to single parents living in Rhode Island who are classified under low-income households, preferably those who have received previous financial assistance from federal programs (source).

BYU Marriott School Single Parent Scholarships: Single parents who have dependent children under their custody can apply for the BYU Marriott School Single Parent Scholarship. Applicants must be enrolled in any degree program of Marriott School and maintain a good academic standing every year. Students that get married will be forfeited from receiving this scholarship (source).

Capture the Dream, Inc. Single Parent Scholarship: Capture the Dream, Inc. is awarding a \$1000 scholarship to residents of the Bay Area who are single parents from low-income

households. The Single Parent Scholarship is available only for applicants that are enrolling in a 2-year or 4-year degree from an accredited academic institution (<u>source</u>).

Custody X Change Giving Fund: Single parents enrolled in any undergraduate course from an accredited college or school can apply for the Custody X Change Giving Fund for financial aid. This scholarship is awarded three times a year (Spring, Summer, and Fall) to eligible applicants worldwide (source).

Deblinger Family Scholarship: The Deblinger Family Scholarship is given to low-income single mothers who are returning to college. Approved applicants will receive two renewable grants based on good academic standing. Read the Silicon Valley Community Foundation website for more information (source).

Downer-Bennett Scholarship: Single parents who are enrolled at the University of New Mexico (UNM) main campus can apply for the <u>Downer-Bennet Scholarship</u>. The applicant must be a continuing undergraduate student with a cumulative total of at least 12 credits earned by the end of the fall semester, and must also earn at least 12 credits each semester for the upcoming academic year (<u>source</u>).

Elevate-A-Life Scholarship: The Elevate-A-Life Scholarship from Melita Group offers single parents up to \$20,000 per year for child care and tuition expenses. The applicant must be from a low-income household, enrolled in a Human Resources-related course, and has at least one dependent who is under 14 years old (<u>source</u>).

Ellen M. Cherry-Delawder Memorial Scholarship: The Ellen M. Cherry-Delawder Memorial Scholarship of <u>Howard Community College</u> is awarded to single mothers with dependent children. The applicant must have attained a minimum GPA of 2.0 and is enrolled or planning to enroll at a business-related degree program in HCC (<u>source</u>).

Ford Opportunity Program: The Ford Opportunity Program provides scholarship assistance to single parents living in Oregon and Siskiyou County, California who are pursuing a college degree. Eligible applicants can either be parents of any age or adult learners who are 25 years old and above. Visit the Ford Family Foundation website for more details (source).

Kathleen McVey Memorial Scholarship: Single parents who are continuing students at the College of the Redwoods LVN or RVN program are eligible to apply for the Kathleen McVey Memorial Scholarship. Applicants must also be high school graduates of either Humboldt County or Del Norte County who are able to demonstrate financial need. Preference is given to single parents with a GPA of 2.5, graduates of Fortuna High School, and those who are planning to invest in a long-term nursing career (source).

LouEllen Dabbs Scholarship: The LouEllen Dabbs Scholarship is awarded to single parents enrolled at Holyoke Community College. The student must be enrolled for a minimum of 9

credits in either Banking or Business Administration and must have a minimum GPA of 2.35 (source).

Minnesota Child Care Grant: The Post-Secondary Child Care Grant Program in the State of Minnesota offers monetary assistance to post-secondary students who have dependents 12 years and under. Eligible applicants must provide proof of financial need must not be receiving assistance from the Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP) (source).

Professional Women of Winston-Salem Scholarship: Single parents in Forsyth County can apply for the PWWS Scholarship Fund and receive up to \$2000 for one quarter or semester. The applicants must be enrolled in an accredited educational institution (<u>source</u>).

Single Parent Scholarship Fund Of Northwest Arkansas (SPSFNWA): The SPSFNWA grants financial assistance to single parents living in Benton, Carroll, Madison, or Washington County. The applicants must be from low to moderate-income households, with a high school diploma or GED. Visit the SPSFNWA website for the full list of requirements (<u>source</u>).

Roadway Worker Memorial Scholarship: The Roadway Worker Memorial Scholarship was created by the American Traffic Safety Services (ATSS) Foundation to provide financial assistance to spouses and dependents of workers who were killed or permanently disabled during construction operations or maintenance activities within roadway work zones. This scholarship has a maximum value of \$10,000 and eligible applicants can get an additional \$1000 from the Chuck Bailey Memorial Scholarship if they can prove that they have a strong commitment to volunteer work (source).

Soroptimist's Live Your Dream Award: Single women can apply for the Soroptimist Live Your Dream Awards if they are the primary financial provider for their dependents and are in need of financial assistance. Eligible applicants must also be accepted or enrolled in an undergraduate degree, vocational, or skills training program, with no previous graduate degree. The Silver Shield Foundation: The Silver Shield Foundation provides tuition fee assistance and counseling services to the spouses and dependents of firefighters and police officers who were killed in the line of duty. Widowed spouses who plan to enroll in an undergraduate, graduate, or vocational program to support their children will receive financial aid from this foundation. Washington-Nixon Nursing Scholarship: Single mothers who are taking a nursing degree in Houston, Texas can apply for the Washington-Nixon Nursing Scholarship. This is a one-time scholarship for eligible applicants who can provide proof of financial need and enrollment to a nursing program from an accredited university.
